	The program enables the student to obtain the academic degree of Master of Clinical Psychology to be able to identify the needs of the individual in accordance with ethical norms, to use methods of psychological diagnosis and intervention in both clinical and psychoconsulting practice.

Aim of the Program	The aim of the Master's program in Clinical Psychology is to prepare a specialist with an academic degree in clinical psychology that meets modern requirements, who will carry out clinical intervention and psychoconsultation process within his / her competence: I. Introduce deeply and systematically the current theoretical and practical approaches in the field of clinical psychology and psychoconsultation; III. To teach the methodology of intervention based on holistic principles and biopsychosocial model;
	IV. Develop skills in information analysis in the field of science, application of evidence-based principles and knowledge, and sharing their own practice in the field of clinical psychology, exchanging views in professional discussions;

	V. To establish the value of carrying out high professional activities in compliance with the principles of human rights, ethics and norms of professional conduct.
